Intent

Implementation

At Iceni Primary Academy, we follow the national curriculum for Geography, ensuring that every pupil develops a deep and meaningful understanding of the world around them. Our curriculum is designed to:

- **Build contextual knowledge** of globally significant places—both terrestrial and marine—exploring their defining physical and human characteristics. This helps students understand how location and environment influence global processes and human activity.
- **Explore geographical processes** that shape our planet, from tectonic movements and climate systems to urbanisation and migration. Pupils learn how these physical and human features are interconnected, and how they vary across space and time.

Through enquiry-based learning, fieldwork opportunities, and the use of real-world case studies, we aim to foster a sense of curiosity and responsibility in our students—preparing them to think critically about global challenges and their role within them.

At Iceni Primary Academy, our Geography curriculum is not only rooted in the national framework—it's shaped by a reflective approach that ensures learning is both **responsive** and **inclusive**. We recognise that every pupil brings a unique perspective and starting point, and we tailor our teaching to meet diverse needs and interests.
